Cancer Support Community Offers *Kid Support*[™] Three-Week Spring Session Starting February 9th *Family Workshop Series for Children and Teens Coping with Cancer in the Family*

St. Louis, MO (January 26, 2016) –<u>Cancer Support Community of Greater St. Louis</u> (CSC) will hold a new spring session of *Kid Support™*, **Wednesdays, February 9, 16 & 23**. *Kid Support™* is a series of three interwoven workshops for children and teens (ages 5-18—divided into age groups), who have a parent, grandparent, or other adult family member with cancer. *Kid Support™* is an evidence-based peer support program led by licensed therapists/social workers experienced in working with children affected by cancer in the family. 1 ½ hour sessions include age-appropriate activities (art, games, writing, cooking, etc.) and provide a safe space for children and teens to talk openly about questions and to have conversations about their loved ones' cancer.

CSC Member Michael said "I was once depressed over my mom's Leukemia and I felt as if I needed to meet others to help cope with it. I met others who are going through the same things as me. The cancer support group is more than a group to me; we are like family."

Parents/caretakers also have the opportunity to meet in their own group for support and education about parenting through the cancer experience, while the children and teens meet. Adult family members learn ways to communicate with their children about their cancer and gain support from other adults. Children and adult groups begin with complimentary dinner and networking.
